

English Requirements and Exemptions for Citizenship

English requirements

To become a U.S. citizen, you must:

- 1. Understand and answer questions about your citizenship application in English
- 2. **Read** 1 out of 3 English sentences
- 3. Write 1 out of 3 English sentences
- 4. Study the civics test (100 questions about U.S. history and government, and answer 6 out of 10 questions correctly), and
- 5. Understand the Oath of Allegiance to the U.S. and take it at a public ceremony

Exemptions to English requirements

Are you at least 50 years old?

- You do not take the English tests if you have had your green card for at least 20 years.
- You must take the civics test in your own language.

Are you at least 55 years old?

- You do not take English tests if you have had your green card for at least 15 years.
- You must take the civics test in your own language.

Are you at least 65 years old?

- You do not take the English tests if you have had your green card for at least 20 years.
- You must take an easier civics test in your own language. You study 20 questions.

Do you have a disability?

- You may get accommodations for the English and civics tests and your interview.
 - If a disability makes it impossible to take the tests, you may apply for a disability waiver. Disability waivers are hard to get approved. Your doctor must complete Form N-648 before you apply and USCIS must accept the form at your interview.
 - Qualifying disabilities for a waiver affect the ability to learn. Examples may be dementia and memory problems, mental illnesses, and learning disabilities.
 - If you have another disability and need an accommodation at your interview, you may contact USCIS to ask for an accommodation.
- You may not have to take the Oath of Allegiance.
 - If your disability makes it impossible for you to understand and answer questions about your application in your language, you may request an oath waiver.
 - Your doctor must write a letter and you must have a legal guardian or US citizen family member answer questions for you at your interview.
